# **2023 PARK USER SURVEY**

#### Introduction

As part of their 2023 Rother District Council campaign, Christine Bayliss and Ruairi McCourt launched their Big Conversation survey seeking views of residents and users of Egerton Park, Bexhill. Knowing that some important decisions would need to be taken if they were elected, Christine and Ruairi felt that an online survey was the most effective way of collecting the views of residents and users that they could take account of, in discussions about the future of Egerton Park.

The survey questions covered a variety of topics ranging from what people most loved about the park to what they would change and who they thought should run the park. They also asked whether respondents had any safety concerns and whether they might be interested in being a community park warden.

The survey was launched at the beginning of April and closed towards the end of May. In total there were 174 respondents to the survey. The survey was largely promoted on Facebook with a small number of respondents filling out hard copy survey forms in the park. (See Figure 1 for example promotion)

The survey makes no claim to being statistically representative of the population of Rother as a whole. However, given the numbers of

respondents, the spread of interests, age ranges (except for under 18-year-olds) and the quality of the feedback we feel comfortable in using the data as being generally representative of the views of the majority of park users.

#### Who completed our survey?

There were 174 separate respondents to the survey. The survey was aimed at those that use Egerton Park and the results of the survey show that all but 4 respondents made at least one visit in the last twelve months with just over 36% visiting at least once a week. The majority of people who completed the survey walk to the park with just over a third travelling by car. When we asked where people lived a third said they lived in Central Ward, just over half said they lived in other areas of Bexhill and nearly 9% saying they lived outside of Rother. Rather surprisingly, only 3 Rother residents from outside Bexhill said they visited the park. There was a good age range although the numbers of under 18-year-olds was disappointing. A full breakdown on the demographics is set out in Annex A.

The purpose of the visits is interesting. By far the largest group, 32.8% were those who bring children to use the play park. This group is matched by a second grouping who use the park for Relaxation (13%), Recreation (8%) and Fresh Air (12%). There are also significant numbers

of dog walkers captured by the survey at 16%. There were smaller numbers who use the park for Tennis and Bowls (both indoor or outdoor) however, this is probably not representative of those users and possibly reflects the demographics – younger tennis players are less likely to use Facebook for social media and bowlers are less likely to be online. A tiny percentage 2.8% said they visit the park to use the café which probably indicates that use of the café is ancillary to their main reasons for visiting the park.




Figure 2 Reasons for visiting the park

#### **Analysis**

The first question was to ask respondents 'What do you love most about Egerton Park?'. Answers were restricted to one selection from the list with an 'other' option. The responses were in line with our expectations. The Children's Playground was selected by just over 30% of respondents and was the most popular selection. This was not surprising given that 32% of respondents said that the reason for visiting the park was to bring children to use the play area.

The next choices were the 'Wildlife' chosen by 22% and 'Trees and Planting' chosen by 21% of those responding.




Figure 3 What do you love most about the Egerton Park

Respondents were then asked an open question about. **'What would you change or improve?'.** 138 people responded with 10% saying that there was nothing to change – it is

great as it is! However, further analysis of the qualitative responses was interesting in terms of areas for improvement and, in many ways they were predictable.

An analysis of the responses shows that 23% mentioned upgrading the toilets. This was the most mentioned area for improvement and is an issue that has been raised regularly over the last four years with local councillors. Typical comments were "The toilet facilities could do with improvements in maintenance and cleanliness" and "The toilets are disgusting".

The next area for improvement mentioned concerned better baby and toddler facilities in the play park. This was highlighted by 11% of those responding "....install more baby swings so we have more than one and also another baby slide that is not in the sandpit" and "More equipment for smaller children. Baby area too small and the rest of it too big and unsafe for most young children. More baby seat swings".

11% of respondents also mentioned secure fencing around the pond which is an issue that has been raised before during the Town Council elections in 2021. This is picked up in more detail when respondents were asked about safety issues.

10% mentioned cleaner ponds which again is an issue raised regularly especially in the summer months when the appearance of the water deteriorates. This issue has since been followed up with Rother Parks Officers and is due mainly to climate change<sup>1</sup>. As the temperature increases so algae blooms become more prevalent. Unfortunately, some of the varieties are hazardous to humans and animals (especially dogs) who might venture into the water. The appearance of algae blooms is a recent phenomenon, but it has led to withdrawal of rowing and paddle boats on the main lake which 5% of respondents highlighted as something they would like to see return.

Other issues raised were: better security, warden and CCTV by 7%, more seating by 7% and additional parking 5%. Another 4% mentioned improved café facilities "a proper indoor café with indoor seating which could open in all weathers all year round would be great".

A full rundown of comments is included at Annex A.

The next question asked '**Do you have any safety concerns**?'. This question was included as candidates for the 2021 Town Council Election had raised this as a campaign issue specifically highlighting the open nature and easy access to water. One third of respondents 33% - responded yes. If they responded 'Yes', they were asked for more information.

Concerns about Anti-Social Behaviour was the most mentioned concerned – highlighted by 24 of the 58 respondents.

"The teenagers are unruly, they smoke, drink and throw their rubbish everywhere and are very intimidating" and "Groups of aggressive and abusive teenagers that I have encountered, whilst there with my daughter". To provide balance another respondent wrote "Anti-social behaviour often by elderly people who think that being old means they can be

rude and arrogant'. Anti-social behaviour has been a constant issue and has been the subject of discussion with Sussex Police and Rother officers. Several respondents highlighted that there could be better CCTV coverage and more warden patrols to enforce the bylaws. "There's not as much anti-social behaviour as people think, but much of what's there could be solved by better CCTV reach and nightly lockups'.

The next most mentioned safety concern was around the open water which was raised by 21 respondents. Typical comments included "Water – no edge / barrier means that it is impossible to keep our two children safe without having two adults at the park" and 'lack of fencing around boating lake to keep young children safe". Conversely, one person highlighted the fact that the layout of the park allowed for conversations with children about water safety "I have 2 children; 2 and a half and 4 months. I think the park offers lots of opportunity to talk about safety with them. We do not need more fences".

Fencing off the water or fencing the play area has been discussed with Park Officers. The risk assessment carried out by the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (ROSPA) found that the current configuration complied with their safety standards and issued appropriate certification. The danger with installing fencing either around the play area (the toddler area is already fenced) or around the lakes is that this would need to be checked daily to ensure it remained secure. In the current financial climate that is probably an unaffordable cost.

When discussing safety concerns one or two respondents mentioned introducing park rangers or wardens and about securing the park at night. In our next question, respondents were asked "Would you be interested in becoming a community park warden?" 77% of respondents said 'no'. However, 9 said yes and 30 responded 'not sure'.

Cllrs Bayliss and McCourt have discussed next steps and feel that this is an issue which could be taken forward in Autumn 2023 and in discussion with Bexhill Town Council. Certainly, given the current financial climate and following the success of the Bexhill in Bloom volunteer gardening – it would need to be organised on a voluntary basis and this is probably best led by the Town Council.

Our final subjective question was 'Who do you think should manage the park?'

The responses were inconclusive with no one option receiving more than 50% of responses. Bexhill Town Council was selected above the other options 39% - those that opted for 'Don't

Know' (28%) numbered more than those that opted for Rother District Council to continue managing the park 23%.




Figure 5 The options for who should manage the park

The relatively high numbers of 'Don't Knows' indicates the lack of public awareness around devolvement of assets and responsibilities from the District Council to other tiers of local government or indeed the voluntary or community sector. This would need to be tackled before any firm decisions are made about the future of the park.




# Q4 Would you be interested in becoming a community park warden?

## Q5 Who do you think should manage the park?




## Q6 How often do you visit the park?


# Q7 How would you travel to get to Egerton Park? (tick the box that mainly applies)



## Q9 Can you tell us something about your age?


