TACKLING HOUSING AND HOMELENESS

I am the lead member for housing on Rother District Council. As such I am determined that housing and homelessness are pushed to the top of the political agenda.

For the last fourteen years the Conservative government has badly neglected housing with over a dozen Tory housing ministers failing to get a grip on the problem. The results are shocking:

- By late 2023 157,640 families were homeless this is 12.1% higher than before Covid.
- A recent Shelter report suggested that 440,000 children across the UK are sleeping on floors.
- £1.7 Billion is spent on temporary accommodation each year.
- Poor housing costs the NHS at least £2 billion per year with terrible impacts due to housing insecurity and overcrowding.



Despite these difficult Tory-created circumstances, Labour (as part of the Rother Alliance) has been able to lessen the impact of local homelessness by:

- Buying our own homes we have gone from a position of having no housing to now having nearly 50 homes. This means we can house people in good quality homes and avoid the costly private sector.
- Recruiting extra staff to help people find accommodation we are now one of the best performing councils on the south coast in this regard.
- Working with developers in East Sussex to build more homes.

Moreover, we'll be working closely with a future Labour government to increase resources to tackle the Housing crisis.
